Payment must accompany all registrations - you may write one check for the total amount of all registrations. Refunds ... Refunds will be issued on an individual basis. All refunds will reflect a \$5 processing fee in addition to cost of materials and/or supplies.

FULL refunds will be given if cancelled due to the COVID-19 restrictions or class minimums are not met.

Program Scholarships ... Financial aid for qualifying residents with financial limitations are available. Contact the District Office. Insurance ... 




