quilt block. They are comprised of simple geometric shapes and are painted in bright colors, in the same patterns found in handmade quilts.


This class offers an opportunity to learn the history of Barn Quilts, the simple techniques of painting them, and cre-

Moped Safety Course

Tim Haas, Today's Driving School

Riding a moped is fun but awareness of safety and the rules of the road are a priority. This three hour classroom-only course includes moped rules and regulations, defensive driving techniques, protective clothing and alcohol information. This course is required by the Department of Public Safety for those who do not have a driver's license and want to ride a moped on the street. Process for participants:

- Must be at least 14 to take the classroom instruction.
 - Are issued a green card upon completion of the class.
- Must be at least 15 to take the written moped permit test.
- After passing the written test, may practice riding on streets within one mile of their home for 30 days.
- Must take the demonstration test within 30 days of receiving their moped permit to get their moped license.

55+ Driver Discount Program Now Available Online For Community Education Programs!

WHAT: To ensure the health and well-being of our students and staff, the Minnesota Highway

Safety and Research Center (MHSRC) is partnering with Community Education Programs to provide an on-line option for our 55+Driver Discount Program (55+DDP). We understand these times are stressful for many and people are



being stretched financially. MHSRC is currently offering Online Classes for students to either renew their existing discount or start saving 10% off their automobile insurance – even while they are staying home. The cost of the 4 hr. refresher class is \$23.95 and the initial 8 hr. class is \$27.95.



Dog Obedience

This class is for dogs 4 months and older and all skill levels. Dogs must be up-to-date on Rabies/DHLP vaccinations. Kennel Cough vaccination is strongly suggested. For younger dogs the emphasis of this class will be on socialization with people and other dogs, along with obedience work. For older more experienced dogs, the emphasis will be on gaining more control and polishing obedience skills: heel off leash, sit, stand, down, stay and come when called. Information will be offered on continued training, training aids, and problemsolving solutions for difficult behaviors.

Dog obedience training is a continuous process. Plan on spending 15-20 minutes each day working with your pet to gain maximum benefit from this class. Participant must be physically able to walk and control dog during the class. Dog must wear a collar (no harnesses) with a 6 foot leather or web/nylon leash (no chain or flexi leashes). Bring soft training treats and a chair. A parent must attend class with youth trainers under the age of 14.

Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns, so that children can get help before they start school.

Early Childhood Screening Covers:

- Immunization records
- Hearing and vision
- Large and small muscles
- Height and weight
- Thinking, language and communication
- Social and emotional development

Who needs to be screened?

All children living in the Breckenridge District who are 3-5 years old and are not currently enrolled in kindergarten. You will have to submit screening information for kindergarten entrance. All of the information from your child's Early Childhood Screening is important to his/her school success. After the screening, you will

know how your child is growing, developing and learning.

Make an appointment.

Screenings are done by appointment only. Call Laura at 218-643-6822.

What if I feel like my child isn't ready?

Screening isn't about "being ready" for anything! It is just a snapshot in time that looks at where your child is physically, emotionally and mentally.

Shouldn't I wait until my child is closer to kindergarten entrance age?

No, this screening has nothing to do with kindergarten entrance other than it needs to be completed before a child enters kindergarten. It is best to have your child screened right when they turn three years old so that if any needs are discovered, they can have two full years to work on them before entering kindergarten.

What if my child fails the "test"?

Test? This isn't a test. There is no passing or failing grade given. It's just a tool of measurement as to where they are at in various areas.
