Crew Updates

Electric: Crew has been doing general maintenance, trimming trees, etc. Director Crocker stated that with the crews being split up the amount of work completed is less but this is what is needed in order to keep crew safe.

Circuit A Boring – Advertisement for Bids

Director Crocker stated that with the cost for boring regarding the Circuit A Underground Project being over \$100K the City needs to advertise for bids. Director Crocker stated that if approved by Commissioners and Council the ad will run until April 24, 2020. Commissioner Graves offered a motion to recommend to the City Council to advertise for bids regarding Circuit A Boring Project. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Martinson. Miscellaneous Updates

Water Plant: Director Crocker informed Commissioners that the New Water Treatment Plant testing procedure ran at maximum capacity (water only) last week. Further, at this time the updated plumbing has been completed. Director Crocker stated that there is an issue with the blow down valve. There seems to be a significant difference between the North and the South Clarifier Tanks. Director Crocker stated that he would like to camera the line and see if the problem can be identified and repaired tomorrow. Cost to use the camera is around \$150.00 per day. Commission members concurred that Director Crocker should rent camera to look at line.

Other

Commissioner Martinson thanked all City employees for the job they are doing during this COVID-19 event. All Commissioners agreed with Commissioner Martinson.

There being no further business Commissioner Graves offered a motion to adjourn at 2:25 PM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Martinson and carried unanimously.
